Banana Bread

- 125g butter
- 150g caster sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 egg, beaten
- 2 very ripe bananas, mashed
- 190g self raising flour
- 60ml milk

- 1. Melt butter, sugar and vanilla in a saucepan over a medium heat and add the mashed bananas. Mix well.
- 2. Add the egg and stir in the flour and the milk.
- 3. Pour into a greased tin.
- 4. Bake at 170 C / Fan 150 C / Gas 3 for 35 minutes, or until a skewer comes out clean. Leave to cool and enjoy!
